2022 Academic Year Application Guidelines for the Japanese Language Adaptation Class "Sakura"

Kanazawa University Affiliated Elementary School

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Kanazawa University Affiliated Elementary School provides elementary school education based on the Basic Act on Education and the School Education Act, conducts research and demonstration of the theory and practice of elementary education, and engages in tasks such as facilitating the teaching practice of university students. In addition, the Japanese Language Adaptation Class, "Sakura," is aimed at not only providing educational support to children from foreign nations who have come to Japan, with a focus on early Japanese language instruction, but also researching how we might best integrate them in elementary school. Those who wish to enroll in "Sakura" should be aware of this purpose, as well as the school regulations, prior to application.

2 Scheduled Admission Date: April 8, 2022

3 Application Qualifications:

- (1) Prospective students must be children from foreign nations born between April 2, 2010 and April 1, 2016.
- (2) Prospective students must be able to arrive in Japan by the end of April, 2022 (The admission date can be changed according to arrival date during April).
- (3) Prospective students must have been in Japan less than six months at the time of enrollment in the school.
- (4) After arriving in Japan, prospective students must live in Ishikawa Prefecture, within an hour commute to the school with a guardian, and must be able to attend school from their guardians at all times, even after enrollment.
- (5) Prospective students must be a family member of a researcher or an international student at Kanazawa University.
- (6) Guardians of prospective students must have a good understanding of the school's educational policies and cooperate in educational activities.

Q What kind of education is provided at "Sakura"?

A: We offer learning activities which help students from foreign nations get used to the daily life and school experience through the basic study of Japanese language and culture during their early stage of life in Japan. Students learn each subject at the same level as their peers, either with regular class or "Sakura" class.

Q How long does a student take classes in "Sakura"?

A: 6 months or 1 year. The period is decided based on the student's acquisition of Japanese. Generally, after 6 months or 1 year, he/she is transferred to a regular class of students the same age.

Q: What kind of teachers do you have for "Sakura"?

A: There are homeroom teachers and teachers in charge of teaching Japanese language. There are also teachers teaching regular classes.

Q How do students get to and from school?

A: Students come to school on foot or by public transportation (e.g., bus). Usually, students come to school by themselves. However, new students are allowed to be accompanied by parents/guardians until they get used to it.

Q What kind of clothes do students wear at school?

A: Students wear school uniforms. There are two designs, one for winter and one for summer. There are also gym clothes for physical education class.

Q What do students have for lunch?

A: Students are to bring their own packed lunch every day. Milk and Japanese tea are to be provided by the school.

Q How much is the monthly fee?

A: About 5,000 yen per month for teaching materials and supporting fees. No tuition fee is required. However, the school uniform and school inner shoes etc., cost around 50,000 yen upon admission.

Q Do you accept new students in "Sakura" only in April? Will there be any change in openings?

A: If the number of openings is not filled in April, we will announce another opening in October. The number of openings will be increased to 8 beginning in the 2023 academic year.

Q What should students bring to school ?

A: We will hold an Enrollment Orientation for newly enrolling students and families. We will provide detailed information at this session.
